These are remedial classes designed for students who have taken and failed a course.

Progress reports will be provided to parents at the completion of the first two weeks of instruction. Upon completion of the course(s) the students will receive a report of their grade(s). Arcola Guidance Office will also receive copies of all student grades for their cumulative records. Out of district students need to make arrangements to have grades sent to their home schools.

Each day of summer school is equivalent to four days of the regular school term. Therefore, it is imperative that students attend all classes. Any classes missed must be made up with the instructor at an additional fee of \$30 per hour for up to two missed classes. **NO CREDIT** will be given if more than two days are missed (year courses) or one day (semester courses). Two late arrivals count as one absence.

All regular school rules are in effect. Lack of cooperation will result in dismissal at the sole discretion of the administration, **in which case, no refunds will be given.**

Students should bring a lunch if attending both sessions. Vending machines are **NOT** available for student use.

Parents must provide their own transportation. Parents must park in the designated areas. There is no supervision outside of class time. Students should arrive immediately before classes and leave immediately after classes.
