Counseling Office: May 1 is the nationally recognized deadline for seniors to send in deposits to their college of choice. Your space will not be "saved" after that date. If you are waitlisted at a school, you will still need to deposit at another school and then if you hear from your waitlist school and you want to attend that school, you will need to send them a deposit notify the school where you originally deposited to decline that acceptance.

You will be completing the senior destination survey in May at which time you will let us know what your plans are for next year. If you are planning on college, you will tell us where you have decided to attend and we will then send your final transcript to that school by the end of June.

Grade Alert – keep your grades in good standing, we have seen colleges rescind acceptances to students who show a decline in their work from the time of acceptance to the end of the school year.

All acceptance and scholarship acknowledgement letters should be brought to the counseling office, even if you will not be attending these schools. All college scholarship notifications will be included in the graduation program, not just the one you decide to attend. Seniors unsure of what they want to do next year should meet with their counselors as well as check the job postings on the wall outside of the main office in the west wing. Your counselor can help you update your resume, assist you with preparing for job interviews and much more.
