Officer Application & Biography

President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Historian

Any student who is a renewing member in Tri-M may submit a biography for an officer position in the Spring of each year, to be considered as an officer in the chapter election over the summer. Traditionally the President is a senior, though qualified juniors and sophomores might also run. **A presidential candidate may not serve as president of another club or ensemble, unless the other office creates no conflict with meetings and responsibilities. All officer candidates must commit to attend TWO (2) meetings per month, with no other club conflicts. Meetings are on the first two Tuesdays of each month, from 2:25 to 3:15 pm.**

If you would like to be considered for a position, prepare a brief, but complete biography of yourself. Your bio should help members make informed decisions that will benefit our group.

You can easily create a bio by referring to the questions below, and answering in complete sentences without bullets or numbers. You may put your answers in any order you choose. You can visit the chapter website for a description of officer duties for each position. You may include additional appropriate information. Limit your bio to 200 words or less.

6. What are the duties of the office you are seeking? (hint: ask the person currently holding that office, or Miss Magann)
7. If you could change one thing about Tri-M through the office you are seeking, what would it be?
8. Do you have an idea for expanding or improving Tri-M? If so, give a few details about how you would present this new idea to the orchestra.
