SUPERINTENDENT GOALS 2023-2024 SCHOOL TERM

GOAL: To provide Methacton School District students, parents, staff and the community with an exceptional experience.

1. To engage, prepare, implement, monitor, and report the results of all strategic planning strategies undertaken by the Methacton School District during the 2023-2024 school term.

Actions:

- Provide written communication updates for the Board on progress of plan by the end of October, December, and March
- Continue to update web application to allow public to monitor progress of strategic plan tasks, strategies, and goals
- Continue the Superintendents advisory group to address matters of importance
- Annual Board presentation on Strategic Plan progress – April 2024

NOTE: Specific strategic plan strategies to be considered within this goal are outlined in the document (*Strategic Plan_Strategies for 2023_2024.doc*)

2. Facilitate the Methacton High School Campus Planning Committee which will be the preliminary body charged with gathering information and making recommendations to the Board of School Directors regarding the comprehensive plan for the high school campus/building and related structures.
 - Produce MHSCPC plan including composition, timeline, structure, and deliverables by end of August 2023
 - Provide a status report to the Board by the end of October, December, February, and April
 - Present the MHSCPC recommendation by end of June 2024
3. Provide document to the Board in October, January, and March summarizing areas of needed improvement and the associated instructional improvement efforts made/planned and their impact/intended impact on student performance and teacher growth and development.
4. Provide the Board a plan and begin implementation of the developed plan to address recommendations contained within the CCIU communications review. Report in October, January, and March on progress towards addressing recommendations.
