 - 1. Dr. Mangano to update inclusive practices for K-4
 - a. Elementary Special Education Advisory
 - Transition and evaluation of MCIU Early Intervention students process begins in December before Kindergarten
 - c. The bulk of her time is with the General Education teachers to help them better include students
 - d. The principals are helping the teachers get what they need to education teachers with inclusion
 - e. They work with predominantly the same behavior agency in the elementary school
 - f. Handed out a chart with each schools staff, support teams and related services (see image of the chart below)
 - g. Supports are placed in each room to help the general education teacher
