

CONGRATULATIONS TO THE CLASS OF 2021!

Three hundred and seventy-three Methacton High School seniors walked across the stage at Subaru Park on June 10, 2021 to accept their diplomas during the Class of 2021 commencement exercises. Forty-one percent of the graduates earned a cumulative grade point average of 93 percent or greater. Ninety percent of Methacton High School's Class of 2021 planned to continue their formal education. Eighty-one percent of graduates are attending a four-year college/university and 8 percent are attending a two-year college or technical school. Nine graduates are entering the Armed Services. The Class of 2021 earned \$22,727,623 in grants and scholarships and served 2,008 collective community service hours.



The Methacton School District has long enjoyed a tradition of excellence in education and community involvement in our schools. The District, formed in 1969, was created by a 10-year merging of the school districts that had previously served the Townships of Lower Providence and Worcester. "Methacton" is a Native American word referring to the "hill" area extending from Eagleville in Lower Providence Township through the Fairview Village area of Worcester Township, one of the highest elevations in Montgomery County. The name was chosen by a majority vote of the community members residing in the District at the time.

A Message From the Superintendent



Welcome to the return of the Methacton School District Annual Report. I am pleased to inform our Methacton community that we will issue an annual report each Fall as a means of sharing a summary review of the previous year’s important aspects and accomplishments.

We believe that sharing information with our community will provide for greater support and trust in the work that we do. It also will help support and build on the values of our community and provide for a responsive, supportive, and focused educational service.

Back in 2019, we introduced the Whole Child educational framework. Since then, we have implemented a number of services and have built our vocabulary around ensuring a healthy, safe, engaged, supported and challenged approach in all that we do. This framework combined with our continued focus on high academic rigor remains at the heart of our mission.

The 2020-2021 school year was confronted with many of the challenges that a pandemic could bring. Still we all -- students, parents, and staff -- adapted and carried on while achieving some

significant accomplishments and milestones. One of those milestones reached is in the approval and construction of the new Arrowhead Elementary School. Positioned to open in August 2022, the Arrowhead Elementary School will feature separate bus and car access along with a STEM space, outdoor classroom and more. This is an exciting time for our community.

The Board of School Directors approved the implementation of full-day kindergarten beginning with the 2022-2023 school year. This program will see a shift in the utilization of staff along with the additional hiring of two Kindergarten positions to round out the needed complement of staff to implement the program.

As one reflects on last year, it is important to recognize the tremendous effort and resilience of the people in our school community -- our students, our parents, our teachers, our support staff, and our administration. Our work together made for a rewarding and memorable year.

Points of Pride

- Five MHS students were named **2021 National Merit Scholar Finalists**.
- 323 MHS students took **a total of 688 Advanced Placement** exams in the 2020-2021 school year. Nearly 90% of AP students earned a **passing score of 3 or better**.
- 29 students were inducted into the 2021-2022 Arcola Chapter of the **National Junior Honor Society**.
- The Board approved **a full-day kindergarten program** to begin for the 2022-2023 school year.
- Ten North Montco Technical Career Center students representing MHS were inducted into the **National Technical Honor Society (NTHS)** in December 2020.
- The Methacton Unified Track and Field team **hosted their first meet of the 2020-2021 season** against Perkiomen Valley HS and Lower Moreland HS on April 19, 2021.
- Thanks to the generosity of our school community, Methacton School District has received **\$6,611.65 through GIANT’s Feeding School Kids initiative**.



- The Board approved a **Kindergarten Ready** summer program.
- The district hosted a **surprise awards ceremony to celebrate the nursing department** on May 12, 2021, which is also **National School Nurse Day**. Our nurses were presented with awards for **EXCELLENCE IN NURSING**.
- Construction began at Eagleville Elementary School in April 2021 to **reconstruct the front entrance, add additional classrooms and correct façade deficiencies**.
- In November 2020, Skyview teacher **Shaun Permar** received an **award from College Settlement** for his **Outdoor Education stewardship**.
- Over **200,000 meals** were served with the curbside distribution program.
- In January 2021, the district hosted a **ceremonial groundbreaking** to mark the start of construction for the **new Arrowhead Elementary School**. The **86,000 square foot school** is scheduled to **open in Fall of 2022**.







Revenue




Expenditures
