The Methacton School District has long enjoyed a tradition of excellence in education and community involvement in our schools. The District, formed in 1969, was created by a 10-year merging of the school districts that had previously served the Townships of Lower Providence and Worcester. "Methacton" is a Native American word referring to the "hill" area extending from Eagleville in Lower Providence Township through the Fairview Village area of Worcester Township, one of the highest elevations in Montgomery County. The name was chosen by a majority vote of the community members residing in the District at the time.








WINDY HILL HYDROPONIC FARM **CULTIVATES STUDENT GROWTH**



Methacton High School is proud to be the first high school in Pennsylvania to operate its own student-run hydroponic farm, Windy Hill Farm! The vision to bring this incredible project to life sprung from the minds of our talented high school science teachers: Mr. Steve Savitz (Environmental Science), Mr. Jeremy Walton (Biology), and Mrs. Tracy

Murray (Biology). The vertical hydroponic farm is custombuilt and contains state-of-the-art technology that receives electricity and fresh water into the shipping container frame.

Students planted the first seeds in January 2022. By the end of the school year, the farm yielded more than 2,000 plants, including tomatoes, cucumbers, several types of lettuce, and

The Hydroponic Farming course supports the district's

focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM). It includes opportunities for hands-on experience and a lab component. The course also places a strong emphasis on business, marketing, computer science, and mathematics concepts.
