- All students in grade 8 will take level one World Language
- Eliminate Literature course and repurpose Reading
 Specialist to provide supplemental reading support in English classrooms and WIN period

• Impact:


- Requires additional sections of World Language

Review all Content area Course Offerings~ 2019-2020


2019-2020~ Continue the conversation:
