On Premises Instruction Update

Current Status

- Montgomery County Department of Health order requiring all schools to provide instruction virtually and to suspend in person athletics/activities from November 23, 2020 through December 6, 2020.
- Determination needed by Superintendent by December 3, 2020 as to a potential return to on premises/hybrid instruction so long as:
 - Based on the PDE Instructional Model Determination Chart
 - County hits moderate level of transmission where less than 100 incidence rate and less than 10% positivity rate.
 - Current County Rates: (11/13-11/19)
 - Incidence = 229.8
 - Positivity = 8.5%

Current Status (continued)

- Board of School Directors approved Winter Athletics and Activities Health and Safety Plan.
 - At the conclusion of the MontCo DOH order, athletics and activities would resume.
 - Given
 - Recent Governor's orders
 - Need for more information regarding the impact on student athletes/teams/conference
 - Need to take a cautious and appropriate action
 - I will suspend return of athletics until December 8, 2020 and place the matter for discussion on the agenda for our Board meeting scheduled for December 7, 2020.

Attestation (part of Governor's new order)

 Attestation and return the signed attestation to the Department of Education by 5:00 p.m., November 30, 2020, or having signed it, nevertheless cannot or does not comply with the above referenced Order and Recommendations, shall utilize a full remote instructional model and shall suspend all extracurricular activities (defined as any activity sponsored or approved by a school entity's governing body, administration, or athletic director, including, but not limited to attendance at or participation in athletics, musical ensembles, school plays, student council, clubs, school dances, etc.), during any period that the county where the public school entity is located is in the substantial range of community transmission.

Considerations for Hybrid Return

- Functional Challenges
 - Transportation and Staffing
 - May need to bring back certain levels/programs at different times
 - Example- Reach Moderate threshold by Dec 10, but have staffing issues at HS Bring back K-8 week of Dec 14 and remain all online for HS until functionally possible to provide on premises.
 - Recognizing this will be challenging for families We will need to allow students that have signed up for on premises to stay online until such time the family can transition
